"Georg" (2007) Director: Peeter Simm (100 min.) – Russian/Estonian/Finnish Film Based upon the life of baritone and Estonian opera singer Georg Ots (1920-1975) and the intricate journey to become famous in the Russian Republic. Before studying singing with the Estonian baritone Aleksander Arder, Ots was a young Navy Officer who had escaped a sinking ship and taken prisoner in Russia. He was released a year later, and on his return home he auditioned for the conservatory in Tallinn. He then became a member of the chorus at the Estonian National Theatre in Tallinn. After a tiny part as his solo opera debut in 1944, he soon became one of the most revered singers with this opera company.

"Abrígate" / Wrap up (2007) Director: Ramon Costafred (90 min.) – Spanish Film Valeria has changed her native Buenos Aires for Betanzos, a town in Galicia where her family comes from.

At 25 she finds herself in the most surreal love-crossroads of her life; following the death of her older. attractive lover, she falls in love with Marcelo, the son of her deceased lover. Her friend Adela, the owner of the hair salon where they both work, helps her to laugh away the sorrows as they both daydream about leading different lives every bit as good as the Parisian posters adorning the walls of their salon.
