Hélène Conway-Mouret earned a higher Diploma in Education at Trinity College Dublin in 1984 and a Diploma in Management Practice at the University of Ulster, Belfast. As a university professor, Hélène Conway-Mouret headed the Dublin Institute of Technology (DIT) School of Languages for fourteen years. In the year 2000, Hélène Conway-Mouret was the Councillor at the Assembly of French Citizens Abroad (AFE) for the Dublin constituency. She was re-elected to the same position in 2006. She was the Co-founder of the Party of European Socialists (PES) Dublin section. From 2011 to 2012, she held the position of Senator for French Nationals Living Abroad. During this time, she was also Secretary of the French



National Assembly Foreign Affairs Committee and National Defence and Armed Forces Committee, Member of the Parliamentary Delegation for the Rights of Women and Equal Opportunities between Men and Women, and Member of the Boards of the Institute of Higher National Defence Studies (IHEDN) and the Agency for French Education Abroad (AEFE). She is currently the Minister Delegate for French Nationals Abroad, attached to the French Minister of Foreign Affairs.
