Krzysztof Jasiewicz is William P. Ames Professor and Head, Department of Sociology and Anthropology at Washington and Lee University, Lexington, VA. He is a native of Poland, received his MA in Sociology at Warsaw University (1972) and his Ph.D. at the Polish Academy of Sciences (1976, also in Sociology). He has taught and/or held fellowships at Warsaw U., Harvard, Oxford, UCLA, and the National Endowment for Democracy in Washington, among others. He has published extensively on elections, voting behaviour, party systems, and political attitudes in Poland and other Central European states. His recent publications include articles in the *East European Politics and Societies* (of which he is currently the editor), *Journal of Democracy*, *Communist and Post-Communist Studies*, *Problems of Post-Communism*, and *European Journal of Political Research*, as well as chapters in edited volumes, in English, Polish, and French.
