



Andrej AUERSPERGER MATIĆ is the Legal Adviser to the European Parliament Liaison Office in Washington, DC. His responsibilities include advising on legal issues in EU-US relations, establishing contacts with Congress in the relevant areas and outreach to think tanks, academia and stakeholders. In his present role, he focuses mainly on digital regulation and competition, EU-US trade relations and human rights. Previous experience includes advisory and litigation work, as Member of the European Parliament Legal Service, in the fields of external relations law of

the European Union and international law (international trade agreements, EU trade legislation, development policy, investment protection issues and other topics) and in the area of justice and civil liberties (EU civil and criminal justice legislation, PNR agreements, data retention). He was involved in litigation before the courts of the European Union in fourteen cases and in numerous legislative negotiations with the European Commission and the Council of Ministers. Before working for the European Parliament, Andrej was a legal officer at the European Court of Human Rights, and a research/teaching assistant at the University of Ljubljana, Slovenia.

Andrej holds a law degree and a master's degree from the University of Ljubljana, an LL.M from the Yale Law School and a PhD from Maastricht University. His doctoral thesis discusses the rule of law and the effectiveness of civil justice in the case law of the European Court of Human Rights. His academic activities include regular lectures and presentations on EU law, trade and investment issues and human rights law at universities in Slovenia, Croatia, Bosnia, Belgium and the United States. In 2016-2017, he visited the United States in the framework of the European Commission Fellowship at the German Marshall Fund in Washington D.C.
