

The *Elysée Treaty* was signed on January 22, 1963 by French President Charles De Gaulle and German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer to consolidate its friendship and cooperation. Sixty years later, the world has changed, as have the challenges for European countries, but the solution remains the same: it is the continuation of the European project.
