Her main research and teaching interests are in the fields of comparative politics, political parties and party systems, governance and politics of the European Union, public opinion, the rise in Euroskepticism, extremist parties, and comparative welfare states. She is also a principal investigator for the Chapel Hill Expert Survey (CHES), which measures political party positions on a variety of policy-specific issues in the European Union.
