Diego Acosta Arcarazo is a lecturer in European Law and Deputy Director for Impact at the University of Bristol. He is the university's Ambassador for Colombia and holds a Ph.D. in European Law, with an expertise in EU Migration Law. Currently, he is interested in the policies of South America and is regularly invited to present his work at international conferences. Dr. Acosta has also provided consultancy for the European Union, the International Centre on Migration Policy Development, Brazil's Ministry of Labour and more. He is a published author in *European Migration Law*, including *The Long-Term Residence Status as a Subsidiary Form of EU Citizenship: An Analysis of Directive 2003/109* (Martinus Nijhoff 2011). He has also co-edited other volumes and has appeared

in prestigious academic journals, including the *International Migration Review*, *European Law Review*, *European Law Journal*, *Journal of Common Market Studies* and the *European Journal of Migration and Law*.
