On the 60th anniversary of the Normandy landings, France decided to grant the Legion of Honor to all the surviving U.S veterans who fought on French soil, honoring them and as well as those who gave their lives in the name of freedom and were therefore unable to receive this award. The Legion of Honor is not only a way to thank these heroes who are still among us for their dedication and sacrifice but is also as a symbol of the Franco-American cooperation that has long characterized our countries' relationship.
