A Conversation with Philippe Etienne, Ambassador of France to the U.S.



Ambassador Philippe Etienne

At the time of the **G7 Summit held in Biarritz last August**, Mr. **Philippe Etienne** was in charge of the summit or "Sherpa" for the French Republic President Emmanuel Macron.

His previous posts in Moscow, Belgrade, Bucharest, Bonn, Berlin and Brussels made him an expert on the European Union and continental Europe. He has also served as an Adviser in the Cabinet of the Minister of Foreign Affairs. Philippe Etienne held other positions in Paris, such as Director General for International Cooperation and Development and President of the Agency for French Education Abroad (AEFE).

A graduate of the École Normale Supérieure and the Ecole Nationale d'Administration, Philippe Etienne also holds a degree in Mathematics and in Economics, and is a graduate of the National Institute for Oriental Languages and Civilizations. He speaks English, German, Spanish, Russian and Romanian. He is an Officer of the Legion of Honor and a Commander of the National Order of Merit.

Ambassador Etienne will exchange with **Senior Fellow David J. Kramer** of the Florida International University's Steven J. Green School of International and Public Affairs. Mr. Kramer who served in the U.S. Department of State and at the German Marshall Fund of the United States has an extensive knowledge of European, Eurasian Affairs and Global Affairs.

A native of Massachusetts, Kramer received his M.A. in Soviet studies from Harvard University and his B.A. in Soviet Studies and Political Science from Tufts University.
