A Conversation About Brexit

Since the UK's narrow vote to withdraw from the European Union (EU) in 2016, a number of questions about everything from citizen's rights to the future of trade relations between the UK and the EU have been raised. With the impending deadline of March 29, this conversation with British Professor McCormick will clarify the current state of these extraordinary negotiations, and highlight some of the domestic and international impacts that Brexit will have.



John McCormick is Professor of political science at the Indianapolis campus of Indiana University. His research and teaching interests lie in comparative politics, global studies, environmental policy, and the politics and policies of the European Union. He has twice been a Jean Monnet Professor of EU Studies, held a Fulbright Distinguished Professorship at the College of Europe in Bruges, Belgium, and has written several books on the EU, including *European Union Politics* and *Why Europe Matters* (both Palgrave Macmillan) and *Europeanism* (Oxford University Press).
