TRANSATLANTIC RELATIONS IN THE SHADOWS OF THE U.S. ELECTIONS

Among many elections this year, the U.S. elections might be the most important, not only for the U.S. but also for Europe's security, economy and international role. No matter which of the two very different candidates wins, European states and the EU have to adjust to the U.S.'s new leadership and foreign policies. To better understand these challenges, Prof. Alana Moceri from IE University in Madrid and Prof. Markus Thiel from FIU will discuss how the U.S. elections have been received in Europe, and how they might shape the transatlantic relationship in the future.
