Position:

SAIS is seeking to appoint a full-time, tenure-track, assistant professor in international relations or comparative politics with a focus on European and Eurasian Studies. The particular emphasis for this position is Europe's relationship with the outside world. Candidates who combine their work on Europe or Eurasia with an interest in international security, international law, conflict management, international development, international relations, or the foreign policy of the United States are particularly encouraged to apply. Candidates able to teach an introductory course in comparative politics or IR theory would have an advantage. The position is located in Washington, D.C. The goal is to fill the position during the fall 2016 semester, with the appointment starting effectively on July 1, 2017. Preliminary interviews will be held at the 2016 APSA meeting in Philadelphia.

Qualifications:

A Ph.D. awarded by June 2017 will be a condition for employment. The ideal applicant will have strong academic credentials and a commitment to improve public policy. A record of excellence in teaching would be a distinct advantage.
